NCLEX pass rate statistics for the vocational nursing program were announced in early November. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics (2016-2017) the job market for vocational nursing is expected to grow 16% which is well above any other vocational field. The median pay for licensed vocational nurses is \$20.76 per hour or \$43,170 per annum. Typical entry-level education for the vocational nursing program is high-school diploma or equivalent certificate.

Licensed vocational nurses (LVNs) provide basic medical care. They work under the direction of registered nurses and doctors. LVNs typically monitor patients' health, provide wound care including changing bandages and inserting catheters and report patients' status and concerns to registered nurses and doctors. Depending on their work setting they may reinforce teaching done by registered nurses regarding how family members should care for a relative; help to deliver, care for, and feed infants; collect samples for testing and do routine laboratory tests; or feed patients who need help eating.

If you're a high-school graduate and actively looking to enter a lifelong career in health care, you should consider vocational nursing as a stepping stone. Many LVNs gain experience in nursing homes or long-term care facilities for a few years and then move up the ladder to become registered nurses and then pursue bachelor of science in nursing degree.
